It's been a busy time here at Taylor's Bulbs over the last few months, here's what we have been upto:



We've installed 1544 solar panels on the roofs of our buildings at our farm at Holbeach. This will save around 125 tonnes of CO<sub>2</sub>e per year and produce approximately 538 MWh of electricity annually.

We've booked to exhibit at RHS Chelsea Flower Show again with our display of Daffodils – chasing our 30<sup>th</sup> Gold Medal at Chelsea in 2023! Charlotte and her team already have bulbs in the cold store in preparation. Look out for further updates.



### We recently launched our new Autumn 2023 ranges, highlights of our range include:

Launch of Allium Purple Crown – a cross between Allium servachium and karataviense which has purple ball flowers. A great feature of this variety is that unlike a lot of Alliums, the foliage stays lush and green throughout flowering.

New range of Select Wild Garden – a range of varieties aimed at gardeners wanting to create a wild habitat.

- Gentleman at Arms, named in recognition of Lord Taylor of Holbeach's service as Captain of the Honourable Corps of the Gentleman at Arms – the ceremonial bodyguard to Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.
- Stainless – sweetly fragrant all white
- Sabine Hay – always an RHS Chelsea favourite
- Gentle Giant – Large flowers with frilled orange cup
- Beige Beauty – unusual colour
- Kildrum – late flowering white/red variety
- Kaydee – white with pink cup
- Sunset Serenade – Split corona, white with yellow stripe
